


QVH update

Did you know?

In 1565, a survey was carried out on Oundle which listed street by street all the properties in the town. It shows that the layout of Oundle has changed little over the last 400 years. Some street names have changed, but others – such as Mill Road and Jericho – have not. The site of the Jesus Church was known as Chapel End, after the chapel of Saint Thomas of Canterbury, which had stood there in medieval times. The survey also contains an interesting reference to the hall of the pre-Reformation guild of Our Lady of Oundle, which had been purchased by "Mr Laxton somtyme maior of London".
