The Longest Day for the Longest Yarn

We were proud to host Oundle Yarn Bombers contribution to the 'The Longest Yarn for D-Day 2024' project commemorating the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings in Normandy, in the Hub at Fletton House on 21 March 2024. The beautifully crafted and incredibly detailed panel of Pegasus Bridge features Lord Lovat, Commander of the British Special Service Brigade, with his personal piper, William 'Bill' Millin and troops. Bill Millin



became a talisman to the troops for continuing to play his pipes during gunfire. The Vice Air Marshal White CB DL of Northamptonshire attended along with Bill Millin's son, John. John Millin was piped into Fletton House by local piper Michael O'Leary and he also received a small set of bag pipes, knitted by Ann Kingdon, from the wool of a jumper his father Bill used to wear all the time. Also on display was a D-Day scene created by Lindy Kirk from Orton Brimbles which depicted landing craft with tanks.
