### **Oundle Medical Practice**

Oundle Town Council continues to do what it can to support the Oundle Medical Practice which is part of the Lakeside Healthcare Group. This includes working on obtaining additional funding so it can take on additional numbers of patients due to the increasing number of new houses being built in Oundle. This includes 130 houses being built on the land off the east side of Cotterstock Road and 65 houses with an extra care facility on the land between St Christopher's Drive and the A605. Last year, Oundle Town Council consulted with Lakeside Healthcare Group on what was needed to expand the Oundle Practice. This was included in the Hearing in Public of the Local Plan by Oundle Town Council.

In September, a councillor representing the council held a meeting with the Chief Executive of the Lakeside Healthcare Group and a senior medical doctor at the practice. It proved helpful and in that meeting they informed the council that the Oundle Medical Practice now have -

- 4 GP Partners
- 1 Salaried GP retiring soon but to be replaced by GP Partner
- 1 Advanced Nurse Practitioner
- 1 Community Nurse
- 3 Practice Nurses
- 3 Healthcare Assistants

### Looking ahead

The Lakeside Healthcare Group & the Practice maintain contact with the NHS Northamptonshire Integrated Care Board – the ICB, who actively seek contributions from developers which is used to support services provided by GP Practices. Oundle Town Council are also in contact with the ICB who informed them that they would work with them to use any s106 contributions received to support the Oundle Practice to take account of additional patients in Oundle: this will be after the occupation of the 50th house on the Cotterstock Road site (expected in January, 2024) and after the occupation of the first house on the St Christopher's Drive site where building has not yet started.
