Update on the Local Area Plan

The Inspector appointed to consider the Local Plan part 2, the successor to the Rural North Oundle and Thrapston Plan as the Planning Authority's development plan, has indicated that various modifications to the draft plan are required while approving the three residential development sites allocated for Oundle in the draft plan: land off Cotterstock Road/St. Peters Road; St Christophers Drive and Stoke Doyle Road. The Town Council had made submissions upon the draft plan and are pleased that the Inspector has said that the council's desire to retain the long stay car park off East Road as a public asset should be expressly included in the finalised plan.

Roadworks continue on New Road

The top of New Road is closed while Anglian Water continues to carry out the planned work to renew the main water pipe. This is to reduce the number of burst clusters and increase water pressure into Cotterstock Road and St Peter's Road. New Road will be closed in sections until the work is completed, which is expected to be on 5 April 2024.
