Dexter Cows return to Snipe Meadow

Thank you to local farmer Craig Baxter from Marshall's Farm, for bringing them back for another year of conservation grazing. Conservation grazing creates a variety of vegetation at different heights, with small areas of bare ground. This is beneficial for a wide range of wildlife in different habitats, and it allows wildflowers to grow, flower, and set seed each year.

An Emergency Bleed Control Kit has been installed outside Queen Victoria Hall on West Street. The Bleed Kit contains specialist equipment to help stem extreme blood loss before the ambulance crews arrive, giving casualties the best possible chance of survival.

Police Operation Snap

Operation Snap has been set up to help keep our county's roads as safe as possible. It allows members of the public to report driving offences in the Northamptonshire area by filling out a form and uploading video evidence they have captured to Northamptonshire Police. Submitted footage and reports are then examined by roads policing officers and can be used to take action against drivers found to be breaking the law.
